Reporting sexual abuse and exploitation

You may choose to report this as a criminal issue, although many victims find this difficult:



Sexual Abuse - has this happened to you?

- Rape, attempted rape or date rape
- Pressured to do something, or touched sexually without permission
- Sending sexual texts and images to someone else without your permission, including 'revenge porn'
- Sexual attention for example 'up-skirting' or other sexual comments
- Sexual acts when you are too drunk or high to give permission
- Sexual acts when you are asleep or unconscious
- Being forced to watch or appear in pornography
- Being stopped from using contraception.

"No matter how much you've drunk... no matter what you wear... no matter if you've kissed... sex without consent is rape".




Sexual exploitation - has this happened to you?

This is when a sexual act takes place in exchange for things like food, shelter, protection, or to pay bills. You may have felt frightened if you did not do what the person wanted, and this can involve a boy or girl friend.

Exploitation means taking advantage of someone

This can happen in the following ways:







Webcams



Websites including mail order brides



Social media and dating sites

How sexual exploitation affects adults

Sexual exploitation has a very serious effect on the physical and mental health of adults. Physical and sexual violence can lead to victims having long-term injuries that impact on their ability to have children, and mental health problems that have a lasting and severe impact on the person.

What are the signs of sexual abuse and exploitation?

These include physical injuries, sexual diseases and other signs linked to someone feeling anxious, stressed, depressed or frightened.

Other signs of sexual exploitation include:

unexpected or unexplained changes in behaviour; withdrawal from social activities and cutting off ties with friends and family; obsession with a new mobile phone and a desire to hide who they are talking to. People who are being sexually exploited are often unaware that they are victims of such abuse.

"I already had problems from the past... people took advantage of me... I started selling my body to pay for drugs"





Who is at greater risk of sexual exploitation?

There are certain factors that can result, lead to, or identify adults that are at more risk of sexual abuse or exploitation.

These include the following:

- Adults with a physical or learning disability are four times more likely to be a victim of sexual abuse
- People who are homeless (rough sleepers) can face a constant stream of sexual suggestions linked to basic needs, which can also be called 'survival sex'
- Women from Black, Asian and Ethnic Minority Groups
- Victims of human trafficking (modern slavery)
- Victims of domestic abuse
- Victims of sexual abuse as a child are also more likely to be victims as adults, although this is not always the
 case.

Many of these factors may overlap or be present at the same time.

Adults suffering from sexual exploitation are also much more likely to die younger than someone in the average population.
